

#### POST-LOCKDOWN WORSHIP

Remember the last public Mass you had at St Dominic's? As you entered the church portico you dipped your hand into the holy water cistern and signed yourself with it. You moved into the church and took any seat that was available, even when the church was crowded. You didn't mind the occasional sneezes and coughs that you heard near or far. You sang and prayed loudly unmindful of the germs that loud singing could spread. When the time for communion came you fell in line with the congregation and received the Holy Communion on your tongue. After the Mass you warmly clasped the hands of people to greet them. You moved to the courtyard to feast on the freshly cooked breakfast. Your soul and heart rejuvenated you bid good bye to your friend with a passing hug and left saying, 'see you next Sunday'.

When will that 'next Sunday' be? When the authorities allow us to congregate again, will you dare to repeat all those rituals of the past?

At Cana the Mother of Jesus told him, "They have no wine." Jesus was standing near the stone jars that were used for the rites of purification by the Jesus. Those jars were empty (like our holy water cistern). By his word Jesus made available the best quality wine. Great! The Messiah of the new order is here. New wine seeks new jars! (Mk 2:22) Lockdown message: prepare new jars!

Nicodemus was advised to be born from above, to bathe in water and in Spirit (Jn 3:3 & 5). What matters is a spiritual new birth. The Jews stunned by the action of Jesus cleansing the temple of Jerusalem were forewarned that the ritual based worship had to be replaced by the new worship that Jesus would offer in his body on the cross (Jn 2:19). Again, the Samaritan woman was told that the new kind of worship would be offered in spirit and truth (Jn 4:23-24). "Present your bodies as a living sacrifice" (Rom 12:1).

The true worshippers must stop seeking bread that will perish, but that which will endure for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give (Jn 6:27). He has power over the forces of nature. By his word he multiplied loaves of bread and walked on water. He empowered a paralytic who had been bound to a pallet for 38 years to take control of it and to carry it around (Jn 5:8).

We are under the grip of a microscopic organism. We are told to follow four steps to protect ourselves from being gripped by it: wash/ sanitize, use mask, keep distance and build immunity. During the course of this lockdown can we use these same methods to protect and empower our spiritual lives? 1, be cleansed and be reborn in the Spirit; 2, keep from spreading spiritual contagion (infection) through speech and evil action; 3, keep a distance from all that pollutes our spiritual integrity; and 4. Build a strong spiritual life – "Learn to live in the spirit" (Gal 5:25). When we come together again, may we all be renewed in spirit.

# Urbi et Orbi: Message of Pope Francis on Easter



Dear brothers and sisters, Happy Easter!

Today the Church's proclamation echoes throughout the world: "Jesus Christ is risen!" – "He is truly risen."

Like a new flame this Good News springs up in the night: the night of a world already faced with epochal challenges and now oppressed by a pandemic severely testing our whole human family. In this night, the Church's voice rings out: "Christ, my hope, is risen! "This is a different "contagion", a message transmitted from heart to heart – for every human heart awaits this Good News. It is the contagion of hope: "Christ, my hope, is risen!" This is no magic formula that makes problems vanish. No, the resurrection of Christ is not that. Instead, it is the victory of love over the root of evil, a victory that does not "by-pass" suffering and death, but passes through them, opening a path in the abyss, transforming evil into good: this is the unique hallmark of the power of God.

The Risen Lord is also the Crucified One, not someone else. In his glorious body he bears indelible wounds: wounds that have become windows of hope. Let us turn our gaze to him that he may heal the wounds of an afflicted humanity. Today my thoughts turn in the first place to the many

who have been directly affected by the corona virus: the sick, those who have died and family members who mourn the loss of their loved ones, to whom, in some cases, they were unable even to bid a final farewell. May the Lord of life welcome the departed into his kingdom and grant comfort and hope to those still suffering, especially the elderly and those who are alone. May he never withdraw his consolation and help from those who are especially vulnerable, such as persons who work in nursing homes, or live in barracks and prisons.

For many, this is an Easter of solitude lived amid the sorrow and hardship that the pandemic is causing, from physical suffering to economic difficulties.

This disease has not only deprived us of human closeness, but also of the possibility of receiving in person the consolation that flows from the sacraments, particularly the Eucharist and Reconciliation. In many countries, it has not been possible to approach them, but the Lord has not left us alone! United in our prayer, we are convinced that he has laid his hand upon us, firmly reassuring us: Do not be afraid, "I have risen and I am with you still!"

May Jesus, our Passover, grant strength and hope to doctors and nurses, who everywhere offer a witness of care and love for our neighbours, to the point of exhaustion and not infrequently at the expense of their own health. Our gratitude and affection go to them, to all who work diligently to guarantee the essential services necessary for civil society, and to the law enforcement and military personnel who in many countries have helped ease people's difficulties and sufferings.

In these weeks, the lives of millions of people have suddenly changed. For many, remaining at home has been an opportunity to reflect, to withdraw from the frenetic pace of life, stay with loved ones and enjoy their company. For many, though, this is also a time of worry about an uncertain future, about jobs that are at risk and about other consequences of the current crisis. I encourage political leaders to work actively for the common good, to provide the means and resources needed to enable everyone to lead a dignified life and, when circumstances allow, to assist them in resuming their normal daily activities.

This is not a time for indifference, because the whole world is suffering and needs to be united in facing the pandemic. May the risen Jesus grant hope to all the poor, to those living on the peripheries, to refugees and the homeless. May these, the most vulnerable of our brothers and sisters living in the cities and peripheries of every part of the world, not be abandoned. Let us ensure that they do not lack basic necessities (all the more difficult to find now that many businesses are closed) such as medicine and especially the possibility of adequate health care. In light of the present circumstances, may international sanctions be relaxed, since these make it difficult for countries on which they have been imposed to provide adequate support to their citizens, and may all nations be put in a position to meet the greatest needs of the moment through the reduction, if not the forgiveness, of the debt burdening the balance sheets of the poorest nations.

This is not a time for self-centeredness, because the challenge we are facing is shared by all, without distinguishing between persons. Among the many areas of the world affected by the corona virus, I think in a special way of Europe. After the Second World War, this beloved continent was able to rise again, thanks to a concrete spirit of solidarity that enabled it to overcome the rivalries of the past. It is more urgent than ever, especially in the present circumstances, that these rivalries do not regain force, but that all recognize themselves as part of a single family and support one another. The European Union is presently facing an epochal challenge, on which will depend not only its future but that of the whole world. Let us not lose the opportunity to give further proof of solidarity, also by turning to innovative solutions. The only alternative is the selfishness of particular interests and the temptation of a return to the past, at the risk of severely damaging the peaceful coexistence and development of future generations.

This is not a time for division. May Christ our peace enlighten all who have responsibility in conflicts, that they may have the courage to support the appeal for an immediate global ceasefire in all corners of the world. This is not a time for continuing to manufacture and deal in arms, spending vast amounts of money that ought to be used to care for others and save lives. Rather, may this be a time for finally ending the long war that has caused such great bloodshed in Syria, the conflict in Yemen and the hostilities in Iraq and in Lebanon. May this be the time when Israelis and Palestinians resume dialogue in order to find a stable and lasting solution that will allow both to live in peace. May the sufferings of the people who live in the eastern regions of Ukraine come to an end. May the terrorist attacks carried out against so many innocent people in different African countries come to an end.

This is not a time for forgetfulness. The crisis we are facing should not make us forget the many other crises that bring suffering to so many people. May the Lord of life be close to all those in Asia and Africa who are experiencing grave humanitarian crises, as in the Province of Cabo Delgado in the north of Mozambique. May he warm the hearts of the many refugees displaced because of wars, drought and famine. May he grant protection to migrants and refugees, many of them children, who are living in unbearable conditions, especially in Libya and on the border between Greece and Turkey. And I don't want to forget the island of Lesbos. In Venezuela, may he enable concrete and immediate solutions to be reached that can permit international assistance to a population suffering from the grave political, socio- economic and health situation.

Dear brothers and sisters, Indifference, self-centeredness, division and forgetfulness are not words we want to hear at this time. We want to ban these words forever. They seem to prevail when fear and death overwhelm us, that is, when we do not let the Lord Jesus triumph in our hearts and lives. May Christ, who has already defeated death and opened for us the way to eternal salvation, dispel the darkness of our suffering humanity and lead us into the light of his glorious day, a day that knows no end.

With these reflections, I would like to wish you all a happy Easter.

### **Basic Ecclesial Communities (BECs/SCCs)** are True Expression of Communion

In Redemptories Missio (RM), St. John Paul II has a specific section in "Basic Ecclesial Communities" (BECs/ SCCs) which says: Because the Church is communion, the new Basic Ecclesial Communities or Small Christian Communities, if they truly live in unity with the Church, are a true expression of communion and a means for the construction of a more profound communion. They are thus cause for great hope for the life of the Church. They are groups of Christians who at the level of the families or as Domestic Church, come together for scripture reading, for reflection, for sharing and listening to each other's problems of everyday life and trying to solve some of them. These communities are a sign of vitality within the church, an instrument of formation and evangelization and a solid starting point for a new society based on a 'civilization of love'(RM-51). He also continues the same theme in his ecclesial document "Ecclesia in Asia" (EA) and exhorts the churches in Asia to build up communities and to be in communion with one another, if they are to be authentic witnesses to the Lord. The BECs/SCCs should not be viewed as another pious association or a prayer group but it should be seen as the "Way of Living" or "The Way of Being Church" in the neighbourhood. It is a collective responsibility of all the faithful in the community.

Everyone is important. One of the basic truths about BECs/SCCs is that it provides space for everyone to feel a sense of belonging to the church. One of the issues that most of the local churches are facing today is that people feel as if they are strangers in the church, in the community of God's people. There is an urgency to create a close link between the pastor of the parish and to the members of the community. In large parishes many of the

sheep can be easily lost if there is no effort to reach out to them. This outreach for those already baptized but living in the periphery is a matter of immediate concern which the SCCs have the potential to address.

Then we have another category in our churches namely the nominal Christians who are lukewarm in their faith or who have lost their faith totally. SCC is a tool that could reach out to them as well, with renewed vigor.

Holistic approach of the SCCs. The promotion of the SCCs should not be taken up in isolation. There are certain other urgent socio-pastoral issues that have to be given attention simultaneously. The most important among them would be the pastoral care of the families and caring for the poor. These have a direct ripple effect on the formation of the SCCs. It is not possible to build the SCCs without the pastoral care of the family. While the SCCs are being promoted in a parish, the concern of the parish towards the 'family' is crucial in today's context. It is necessary to understand the situations within which marriage and family are lived today, in order to fulfil the task of "communion". Without the spirit of communion in the family it will not be practical to think of communion in the BECs/SCCs. It will be like trying to build a house without the foundation. Thus, a greater understanding and care of the existing realities regarding the family is essential in the field of BECs/SCCs (Familiaris Consortio-04).

Today, we certainly need a mechanism to hold our parish communities intact. For that matter there is no better methodology than that of the BECs/SCCs which is not simply a way of promoting communion but rather that which is communion itself.



### O LORD STRENGTHEN MY FAITH

The impact of the stringent LOCKDOWN did not initially appear to impact my Life. After all, I thought, it's only a few weeks, and anyway I am at home. But when it dragged on (for various good or not so good reasons) further to versions 2.0, 3.0 and now 4.0, I found that Life itself had changed, and with that Me ..or should I say my *attitude towards Life and Faith*.

The subtle changes in my personal Life started actually in

2000 and as the years went by, I found that in the turmoil's that buffeted me, I had no alternative but to ask "Lord help me, or else I perish". The opportunity to be able to attend formal Church, sit at the third last pew, just sit quietly and pray, to attend Mass and receive Holy Eucharist - were soothing elements in my topsy turvy life. At no time, I felt let down, God helped me, protected me every time I came across a bump in the road.

Then this long Lockdown period commenced on March 25, where attending Mass, Rosary, Stations of the Cross was on YouTube, and it got me thinking, despite all the difficulties one is facing, I am still alive and "kicking". But, when so many of my friends were getting crazy, because of the restrictions and find themselves closeted, I somehow did NOT feel any such pressure. So I introspected, as to what helped me (being 68, with long term Diabetes, Hypertension; Heart Issues post stroke; with a recent hypoglycaemic 55 minute fall which injured my head all which made me comparatively more vulnerable than others) manage this period. A few thoughts that I can share are:

#### TRUST and FAITH IN THE ALMIGHTY

My initial formative years, my late Mother taught me that we must trust God in all things. We read in the book of *Proverbs 3:5: Trust wholeheartedly in Yahweh, put no faith on your own perception* - if I have faith in God, I was told, not only do I have to trust Him to provide provisions, but I need to be completely confident that He will provide for me, in His own way. And HE HAS.

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?" (Mt 6:25-27)

#### **PRAYER**

I learnt to pray as if God is in the room sitting right next to me. In the gospel of Mark 11:23-24 Jesus says, "In truth I tell you, if anyone says to this mountain, be pulled and thrown into the sea, with no doubt in his heart, but believing that what he says will happen, it will be done for him. I tell you, therefore, everything you ask and pray for, believe that you have it already, and it will be yours". I think its okay to give Him every single one of my burdens, worries, and fears. It's okay to ask God to intervene in my life and ask Him for the provisions that I need. Prayer, as many time I have heard preached - is a personal relationship with Our God, and so it is with me. God helped me overcome the obstacles.

Over the years I have felt that irrespective of the turbulences I went through, it was faith that helped me withstand the ravages that came in my Life. I believe that any form of prayer is fine, whether it be formal or informal, as long as I am able to communicate one-is-to-one with God, I would feel good. I believe that I must *pray and give thanks in all sorts of circumstances*, and I have witnessed a number of situations that tended to shake me, but I continued reaching out to God. I may have faltered many times, but God lifted me and put me back on the right path. In retrospect, when I recall the most darkest moments of my personal space specially between 2015 to 2017, it was HE who carefully led me ahead, I was able to do things I never dreamt I was capable of!

#### THE SCRIPTURES

These days I make time to sit down and read the Bible and Other books that I have acquired over time. I realised that knowing God's Word goes hand in hand with trusting in God and praying to God. Many years ago, I came across a good booklet on *Psalms – Prayer*, *Praise and Promises by Warren Wiersbe*, and I take the opportunity to read through the selected portions of the Psalms. The Psalms are an excellent source of comfort, of courage, of strength

for me!

In God's Word I think I have found great strength to carry on with life in peace, and experiencing a different sort of joy. This coronavirus lockdown time, I have looked back and I realise that I have gradually gained in personal confidence, knowledge, and understanding of the importance of God in my life, such that despite the loss of loved ones, I can still smile and carry on.

#### BE THE LIGHT

In my early catechism I was explained that as Christians we are the light of the world, so I have tried, in many small ways, to be caring towards those whom I have interacted with, I have tried to encourage, to advise, with the intention of building the character of many people I meet.

I believe that God has given me talents; it is essential therefore I must share these talents for the Church and in helping (serving) Others. I believe that in my personal and professional life, outsiders should be able to see in me a **God-first life**; let my actions try and draw people closer to God. "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up". (Mt 5:16)

#### LIVE OUT HIS WORD

Applying the Word of God to my own Life, I have seen how HE has deepened my walk with Him (He has always led me by my hand). The miracle at Cana where Jesus turns the water into wine is the first sign that Jesus performed. Mary becomes the mediator between the household and Jesus. The transformation takes place when the creature encounters its Creator. The miracle at the wedding at Cana has its own prominence in the gospel since it has been considered as the first miracle of Jesus.

As was the custom of the Jews, wine was considered the most important item at a wedding party and scarcity of wine would bring shame on the family. Mary noticed that they had no wine. Every good action begins from observation. One could see a thing and choose either to ignore it or to act upon it. Mary becomes a model for us in this respect. She noticed that they had no wine. She chose to intervene in their life at the apt time.

In our day-to-day life we do encounter many situations in which we could act and thus glorify the Lord. But due to our negligence, ego or ignorance we just let go of all the opportunities to do good for others. Mary said, 'Do as He tells'. Mary had trust and confidence that her son could do something for the family. She might never have expected that her son could turn the water into wine rather she had the confidence that her son would save the struggling family. Mary still repeats to us the same thing, "Do as He tells you". She does not ask us to do extra-ordinary things. She just asks us to submit

ourselves totally to His holy will because He knows what is good for us.

Jesus asked the servants to fill the six empty jars. Six is an incomplete number but the presence and the intervention of the Lord makes it perfect and complete. He does always tell us to fill our jars. Though we feel empty, useless and good for nothing at times, remember God is there waiting to fill our emptiness with his love, peace and joy. He wants to turn out our imperfection into perfection. He eagerly waits to act upon our lives. We need to ask Jesus to fill our lives with faith, hope and charity especially during these days of lockdown where we are deprived of the Sacraments and sacramentals.

Jesus prayed and water turned into wine. When the water met the Lord, it blushed and turned into wine. It's the mystery of life. Whatever is dry, deserted, fruitless and forlorn will find its meaning and fulfilment in the presence of the Lord. Every emptiness, nothingness and failures is a means for God to reveal His Glory. The painful and difficult situations of life; especially during these times of isolation, lockdown and great pandemic our life may seem to be meaningless but the miracle of water turning into wine reveals to us that every obstacle of life is the way the Lord to opens the door of grace, so that we may realize our nothingness and glorify the Lord who is the source of all blessings.

Diagnosis: COVID-19

Current situation: On ventilator with fluctuating vitals struggling to maintain the Oxygen saturation. Maria without giving up on courage, fighting with herself to overcome the deadly virus and to go back to her loving husband.

Suddenly, ICU phone rings asking for emergency. A middle-aged man Johnny aged 55 is brought in. He is unable to breath due to lung congestion. Oxygen saturation is gradually falling below normal. He needs immediate intubation for ventilating the lungs to maintain the oxygen flow.

Nurse whispers to the Doctor, "Doctor, we do not have another ventilator. What are we going to do?"

The Doctor is silent. He shudders. He has two patients with life at threatening situation. The doctor has limited choices. He looks at the "Ventilator Deserving Chart"

खोफ यानी डर सुष्टि के प्रत्येक प्राणी में होता है। चाहे जीव-जन्तु हो, कीड़े-मकोड़े हो या इन्सान सभी के अंदर यह डर विद्यमान है। डर के कई कारण और प्रकार होते हैं। लेकिन खौफ या डर का केंद्र बिंदु या कहें मंजिल एक ही होता है-मृत्यु। मृत्यु ही है जो प्राणी के अंदर डर पैदा करता है।

मैं जानता हूँ, कई लोग यह कहेंगे कि हर डर का कारण मृत्यू नही है। कुछ डर स्वाभाविक होते हैं जो जीवन बचाने के लिए खतरे से भागने के लिए दिए जाते हैं। यह भी सत्य है। किन्तु वह स्वाभाविक खतरे का डर का कारण भी तो मृत्यू ही है और यही तो जीवन बचाता है।

संसार में डर सबसे पहले आदम से उत्पन्न हुआ। उत्पत्ति ग्रंथ अध्याय तीन में हम पढते हैं कि आदम और हव्वा पाप करते हैं और छूप जाते हैं। जब ईश्वर ने आदम को पुकारा तो उसने कहा, "तेरी आवाज सुनकर मैं डर गया और छुप गया" (उत्पत्ति 3:10)। यहाँ आदम के उस डर का केंद्र भी मृत्यू था, क्योंकि ईश्वर ने कहा था कि, "यदि तुम उस भले-बुरे के ज्ञान के वृक्ष का फल खाओगे तो अवश्य मर जाओगे" (उत्पत्ति 2:17)।

डर पाप से उत्पन्न होता है तथा मृत्यु पर समाप्त होता है। जैसा कि संत पौलुस कहते हैं, "पाप का वेतन मृत्यु है" (रोमियों: 6:23)। हम डरते इसलिए हैं क्योंकि हम मृत्यु से डरते हैं और मृत्यु से इसलिए डरते हैं क्योंकि हम पापी हैं। ईश्वर की आज्ञा भँगकर हर क्षण हम पाप करते हैं। अपनी बोली से, सोच से, अपने व्यवहार से. और कर्म से हम पापी ठहराये जाते हैं।

किन्तु यह भी सत्य है कि हर डर का कारण मृत्यू नहीं होता, जैसे बदनामी का डर तथा खोने का डर। क्योंकि कोई भी व्यक्ति अपने धन-दौलत, इज्जत-शोहरत, परमप्रिय लोग और वो सभी कुछ जिन से वह अत्यंत प्रेम करता है, उसे खोना नहीं चाहता।

निर्दोष व्यक्ति को भी डर लगता है। क्योंकि हर कोई जीना चाहता है, मरना नहीं। लेकिन अफसोस की बात है कि कोई भी आत्मा के खो जाने से नही डरता। डर, खौफ या दहशत मनुष्य स्वयं ही उत्पन्न करता है और मृत्यु की ओर जाता है। कुछ लोग दूसरों के जीवन में खौफ पैदा करते हैं, धमकाते हैं। और वह दूसरा व्यक्ति अपने जीवन को बचाने के लिए उस से खौफ खाता है। क्योंकि मृत्यु का डर उसे आतंकित कर देता है। इसे आप स्वाभाविक डर कह सकते हैं। यहाँ डर का कारण पाप नही है, वरन मृत्यु है। मृत्यु का डर ही उसके जीवन की रक्षा करता है।

हम जानते हैं कि प्रभु येसु को कैसी भयानक मृत्यु दी गयी। पर मृत्यु तो पाप का दंड है और प्रभु येसु तो निर्दोष थे, तो मृत्युदंड उन्हें क्यों? बेशक, वे निर्दोष थे, पर वो मनुष्य के पाप थे, जो उन्हें इस संसार में ले आए और उन्होंने मनुष्य की मुक्ति के लिए निर्दोष होने के बावजूद मृत्युदंड को स्वीकारा। उन्होंने मृत्यु को स्वीकार कर मृत्यु पर विजय पायी और मनुष्य के मृत्यु के भय को मिटाया। अपनी मृत्यु द्वारा उन्होंने मनुष्य को बताया कि पापों से दूर रहो जिससे तुम नरक से और विनाश से बचे रहो। ईश्वर के उस कहर से बचे रहो जिसे सदोम और गोमेरा ने तथा जल प्रलय के द्वारा सृष्टि ने झेला था।

इस समय सारा विश्व कोरोना की महामारी से दहशत में है और हर कोई डरा हुआ है कि उसे कोरोना न हो जाए क्योंकि इसका होना यानी मृत्यु होना। क्योंकि इसका कोई इलाज नहीं है। यह महामारी मनुष्य के कर्मों का ही कारण है। दु:ख- विपत्ति, संकट, महामारी ईश्वर की ओर से उनकी इच्छा से मनुष्य के कर्मों का दंड है। पर मनुष्य इसे मानने और समझने को तैयार नहीं है। वह लगातार ईश्वर की आज्ञाओं की अवहेलना करता जा रहा है। बल्कि यह कहता है, दु:ख और सुख तो जीवन का हिस्सा है, स्वाभाविक है। बेशक, यह जीवन का हिस्सा है लेकिन यह भी

ईश्वर की इच्छा से है बल्कि, दुःख से ईश्वर की महिमा प्रकट होती है।

इस महामारी में लाखों लोगों की मृत्यु हो गई। इस का मतलब यह नहीं कि मरने वाले सभी पापी थे। मृत्यु तो स्वाभाविक है जो सब को आएगी। यह तो ईश्वर के विवेक की बात है। उसने तो सब के जीवन की गाथा पहले से ही लिख दी है। यह सब कुछ जानने के बावजूद भी मनुष्य अपने आप को सुधारने का प्रयत्न नहीं करता है। सांसारिक जीवन में इस तरह मशगूल है कि उसे ईश्वर का भी डर नहीं है।

मैं ये नहीं कहता कि उरना नहीं चाहिए, उरना चाहिए पर मृत्यु से नहीं वरन ईश्वर से और आत्मा के खो जाने के भय से। मृत्यु तो एक दिन सबको आनी है, इसके लिए हमें तैयार रहना है, अपने पापों को त्याग कर। क्यों कि "प्रभु ईश्वर यह कहता है, मैं हर एक का उसके कर्मों के अनुसार न्याय करूँगा। तुम मेरे पास लौट कर अपने सब पापों को त्याग दो। कहीं ऐसा न हो कि तुम्हारे अपराधों के कारण तुम्हारा विनाश हो जाये। अपने पुराने पापों का भार फेंक दो। एक नया हृदय और एक नया मनोभाव धारण करो। तुम क्यों मरना चाहते हो? में किसी भी मनुष्य की मृत्यु से प्रसन्न नहीं होता। इसलिए तुम मेरे पास लौट कर जीते रहो।" (एजेकिएल 18:30—32)।

सचमुच प्रभु हमारी मृत्यु से प्रसन्न नही होता। वह तो स्वयं हमारे लिए मर गए और मृत्यु पर विजय पायी। वो हमें अपने पास बुलाते हैं। पर हम पाप के, अधर्म के गर्त में फँसकर उनसे दूर भागते हैं। जब विपत्ति और महामारी आती है, तो प्रभु—प्रभु कहकर पुकारते हैं। और जब वो नहीं सुनते हैं तो हम कहते हैं कि प्रभु है ही नहीं। वह सुनता ही नहीं। लेकिन इसायस नबी कहते हैं, "प्रभु का हाथ बचाने में समर्थ है। उसका कान बहरा नहीं हैय वह सुन सकता है। किन्तु तुम्हारे अधर्म ने तुम को ईश्वर से द्र किया। तुम्हारे पापों

ने ईश्वर को तुम से विमुख कर दिया, इसलिए वह तुम्हारी नहीं सुनता।" (इसायस 59:1—2)।

मृत्यु एक कड्वा सत्य है, किंतु ईश्वर क्यों कहते हैं कि मैं तुम्हारी मृत्यु से प्रसन्न नहीं हूँ? उनका तात्पर्य शरीर की मृत्यू से नहीं किन्तू आत्मा की मृत्यू से है। आत्मा की मुक्ति ही हमारे जीवन की मुक्ति है। और वो मृक्ति प्रभ् येसु के द्वारा ही मिलेगी। "जिस तरह एक ही मनुष्य के आज्ञा भंग के कारण सब पापी ठहराये गये, उसी तरह एक ही मनुष्य के आज्ञापालन के कारण सब पापमुक्त ठहराये जायेंगे" (रोमियों 5:19)। इसलिये ईश्वर ने हमें यह अवसर प्रदान किया है कि हम अपने सभी अधर्मों को त्यागकर उसकी ओर लौट चलें. और अपने डर को मिटा दें। हमने पाप किया है इसलिये कष्ट तो आएँगे, किन्तु प्रभु पर भरोसा रखते हुए हमें ईमानदार बने रहना है। प्रमु कहते हैं, "त्म्हें जो कष्ट भोगना होगा, उस से मत डरो। तुम मृत्यु तक ईमानदार बने रहो और मैं तुम्हें जीवन का मुकुट प्रदान करूँगा" (प्रकाशना 2:10)।

हम प्रभु के दूसरे आगमन की बाट जोह रहे हैं, लेकिन हमें नहीं पता वह घड़ी कब आएगी। कई लोग इस समय कहते फिर रहे हैं कि संसार का अंत आ गया। ऐसी कितनी ही वीडियो इंटरनेट में मिल जाएंगी। जब -जब संसार में कोई बड़ी विपत्तियों का आतंक आता है तब ये लोग यही कहते हैं। वे तो यहाँ तक कह देते हैं कि फलां महीने की फलां तारीख को दुनिया का अंत हो जायेगा, पर होता कुछ नहीं है। ये भी तो लोगों के मन में खौफ पैदा कर रहे हैं, और लोग अपने जीवन को बचाने के प्रयास में लगे हुए हैं। चाँकि किसी को कुछ भी नहीं पता वो समय कब आएगा, इसलिए, हमें अपने आप को तैयार रखना है। क्योंकि प्रभु का कथन तो पूरा होकर ही रहेगा-"देखो, मैं शीघ्र ही आऊँगा। मेरा पुरस्कार मेरे पास है और मैं प्रत्येक मनुष्य को उसके कर्मों का प्रतिफल दूँगा। मैं आल्फाऔर ओमेगा हुँ" (प्रकाशना 22:12–13)।
